Background of the MMCSA Scholarship

The Metropolitan Male Choir of SA has a strong reputation for its work within the community. A major focus of the choir is our youth development program in the Instrumental and Vocal Scholarships.

The MMCSA scholarship programme was initiated in 2000 by Geoff Sieben (a member of the choir for 64 years) and Frank Vanehouse. They saw the choir as an organisation with a community spirit and purpose. Bill Scott took over a significant administrative role from 2002 from Frank, working alongside Geoff Sieben until 2020. The intention was and continues to encourage music making and love for music in the younger generation of music students and to encourage those with talent to continue to the point of making music their career choice.

The Scholarship is open to Instrumentalists and Vocalists aged 12 - 16 years. The idea is not just a monetary prize but also to provide opportunities for them to perform in quality live concerts and thus assist them in making a start on their musical career paths.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. Eligibility:

The Metropolitan Male Choir, Y2025 music scholarship program for **solo Instrumental/Vocal performance**, is offered to young people with proven musical ability.

Applicants must be 12 to 16 years of age on January 1, 2025.

Applications are considered subject to certain provisions. (*see ‘Conditions of entry’ below*)

2. Monetary award/s

Subject to meeting ‘*an appropriate standard*’ condition as determined by the adjudicating panel, the following awards will be made:

1. An amount of **Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00)** for the MMCSA award will be made to the first prize winner.
2. An amount of **One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)** for the Geoff Sieben/Bill Scott award will be made to the second prize winner in recognition of Messrs Sieben’s and Scott’s coordination of the choir scholarship since 2002.
3. In the unlikely event that two candidates are adjudged equal prize winners, prize money will be shared in a manner considered appropriate by the Choir Management Committee. Prize money will be paid to the successful applicant/s in two half instalments, in May and December 2025.

In addition, a privately sponsored Award, to a maximum value of **Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)**, may be offered at the discretion of the sponsor, Mrs June Genders OAM. This award is not a third-place award, but will place greater emphasis on entertainment value, perceived potential, presentation etc. First or Second place winners, as detailed above, will not be deemed eligible.

Acknowledgement – The MMCSA acknowledges the generous financial support given to the Scholarship program by Mrs. J Genders, OAM, former accompanist and Vice Patron of the Choir.

3. Guest artist appearances

Further to the above, the Choir will offer Scholarship award winners the opportunity to perform as unpaid supporting artists at one or more concerts during the tenure of the Scholarship or shortly thereafter. In particular, the first prize winner will normally be invited to perform at our annual ‘Variety’ concert (August-October) in the Norwood Concert Hall.

4. Tenure

The scholarship/s will be offered for a period of 1 year from January 1 to December 31, 2025.

5. Entry fee

An entry fee of \$20.00 applies to all applications and is payable online to the ‘Metropolitan Male Choir of SA Inc.’ – BSB 065-125, account number 1038 5982 using reference MS2025 (*Your name*).

7. Conditions of entry

Applicants will be considered for an award subject to the following provisions:

- 7.1 Previous winners of the First Prize, the MMCSA Prize, are ineligible to apply.
- 7.2 Applicants must be resident in South Australia at the time of application. Prize winners are required to be prepared and available to support the MMCSA at public performances during the tenure of their scholarship award. (*see para 3 above, 'Guest artist appearances'*)

7.3 Important

Each applicant is required to complete and submit the "MMC Music Scholarship" application form (appended below) together with a personal history record, providing details as follows:

- 7.3.1 Name,
- 7.3.2 Date of birth, (applicants must be 12-16 years of age on January 1, 2025)
- 7.3.3 School attended,
- 7.3.4 Study year etc.
- 7.3.5 Vocal experience or type of instrument/s studied.
- 7.3.6 Years of musical study, examinations, level achieved etc. (recommended minimum level of achievement e.g., AMEB Gr 6 or equivalent)
- 7.3.7 Name/s of teacher/s (together with Telephone Nos. if possible)
- 7.3.8 Awards, prizes, public performances
- 7.3.9 Other relevant information.

8. In addition, it is required that applicants: -

- 8.1 submit at least one referee statement together with a supporting statement from parent/s, carer, or guardian.
- 8.2 demonstrate a strong desire to continue their musical development.
- 8.3 submit to such audition as may be considered appropriate by a panel of judges.
- 8.4 be available, if requested, to attend for interview before a final selection is made. (*see para 5 above re payment of entry fee*)

N.B. Please note that applicants may not be selected for audition subject to a review by the panel of the applicant's suitability and appropriate detail provided in the application and supporting material.

9. Auditions:

Auditions for selected applicants will be held on 7 September 2024 at Rosefield Uniting Church, 2 Carlton Street, Highgate, SA 5063.

Applicants should present at least 2 items of a contrasting nature, (Instrumental applicants may consider 2 contrasting excerpts of the same work) and should submit an authorised copy of all music to PO Box 12, Highgate, SA 5063 two weeks prior to the audition date, to be presented for scrutiny by the adjudicators. If not received in time, applicants may be advised of their inability to perform. Note that applicants are solely responsible for securing the services of an accompanist, if required.

9.1 Performance time. It is a firm requirement that performance time at audition be contained within the limits of 7 to 12 minutes. Applicants risk dis-qualification if these limits are exceeded.

9.2 It is suggested (but not essential) that applicants should consider audition in one discipline (instrument or voice) only. Audition in more than one discipline will not necessarily afford any advantage to the candidate.

Notices to applicants selected for audition will be sent by email by **3 September, 2024.**

9.3 Note: - It is expected that candidates will be accompanied by parent/s, carer or guardian at auditions and where necessary, at post audition interviews. (*See para 10 below*)

10. Scholarship Awards/Post Audition Interviews

A panel of judges will adjudicate at auditions and make recommendations as appropriate to the Choir Management Committee. Scholarship awards will normally be determined immediately after the completion of all auditions with successful candidates being notified within the following 48 hours. However, if no immediate decision is possible, applicants still under consideration for an award may be asked to attend a post audition interview with members of the Choir Scholarship Committee, in which event they will be notified accordingly, by telephone or E-mail, on or before **12 September, 2024.**

11. Administration

Authority for the day-to-day exercise of the Choir scholarship awards rests with the Choir Scholarship Committee. However, the Choir Management Committee will at all times be responsible for over-riding administration of the program and where necessary will act accordingly.

It is emphasised that the Metropolitan Male Choir of South Australia Incorporated Scholarship awards are made at the absolute discretion of the Management Committee of 'the Choir' and that no correspondence with respect to award decisions will be entered into, nor will 'the Choir' be liable under any legal action arising therefrom.

12. Privacy / Protection

Applications will be treated as 'confidential'. Names, images and limited details about prize winners will only be made public consistent with the provisions of the Choir's Child Protection Policy and following the prior consent of the applicant and parent/carer/guardian. Conduct of the Scholarship will always be consistent with provisions of the Choir's Child Protection Policy which is available on the choir's website <https://mmcsa.org/child-protection-policy/>

13. Default

The Scholarship Committee will report any failure by successful applicant/s to fulfil obligations to the Choir, consistent with the terms and conditions of the award/s. Subsequent action, which may involve cessation of payments, will be determined by the Choir Management Committee.

The Choir management may not be able to accommodate difficulties that applicants have with the Scholarship timetable. While every effort will be made to accommodate preferences regarding performance times on the day of auditions, please be aware that scheduled times (once published) may not be negotiable.
